
#### Y3/4 Swimming

### **TMPF Debt Recovery Policy**

As Great Wood is part of The Moorlands Primary Federation, we adhere to their, 'Debt Recovery Policy'. This means that no school lunches bill will be allowed to exceed £30, before action will be taken. Upon a bill exceeding this amount the family concerned will receive a letter to inform them of the debt and ask for payment within 2 weeks. Unfortunately, until such debts are settled, we will be asking the children concerned to be provided with a packed lunch, as we will be unable to provide any further school meals, until the debt is cleared.

If the debt is not cleared within two weeks the matter will be escalated via a second letter - which outlines the next stages of the process, which may include legal action.

Of course if you have any concerns, or queries regarding this matter please contact Mr Adamson, or the school office and we will do our best to help you. We appreciate that all circumstances are individual.



### **Scholastic Book Fair**

On Thursday 14th March we will be holding our Book Fair. The Book Fair will be open before and after school. The Book Fair brings a wide selection of books suitable for all of the year groups, from Reception up to Year six. For every £1.00 that we raise at the book sale, school will receive commission, enabling us to extend the school library and reading resources for our children.

Each child will receive a National Book token to use against the purchase of any book costing over £2.99 at our book fair, participating book shops, or clubs.



### E-safety

Please be aware there is some unpleasant content on the internet at the moment that appears to be gathering attention. The "Momo Challenge" is an alleged form of cyberbullying that spreads through social media and mobile phones. After users are enticed to contact another user named "Momo", they receive graphic threats from this character and are instructed to perform a series of dangerous tasks. Please keep a close eye on what your child is looking at on the internet.
