

Your folks will be doing a number of things to keep them focused, happy and skilled up: from fire striking to creating cooking fires; making hot drinks; baking pizza and breads over an open campfire, wide games-scavenger hunt, tug-o-war, foraging; making woodland products-mallets, woodland friends, woodlalions; using sharpedged tools; building shelters and dens; learning tracking skills; using walkie-talkies in the woods; learn to whittle safely with a real forester's knife; bird and wildlife watching and many more themes besides – the sessions are free-flowing child centred and the activity choice is dependent upon them and so the actual content may differt My twenty year plus track record shows that everyone leaves more than contented, inspired, skilled, happy and ready for a great night's kip!

Please ensure that your young folks are well equipped for the woodland: all their own personal medicines, a rucksack or sturdy bag containing their kit (not plastic, filmsy or paper bags), wet weather gear (coat, over trousers & hat), warm hat, a blanket and kneeling pad to sit on (for around the camp fire), sturdy shoes, bots or Wellingtons, long-trousers, long-sleeved tops, warm layers & gloves, a pair of heavy duty gardening gloves that fit them, a mat/thick plastic bag to sit on, their packed lunch & a mug. Kindly ensure that the medical and photo consent forms are completed and returned
