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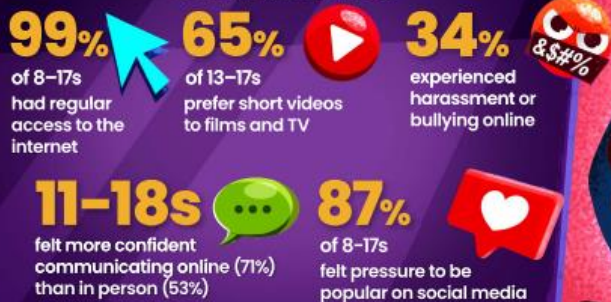


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What Parents & Educators Can Learn from the OFCOM MEDIA REPORT 2024

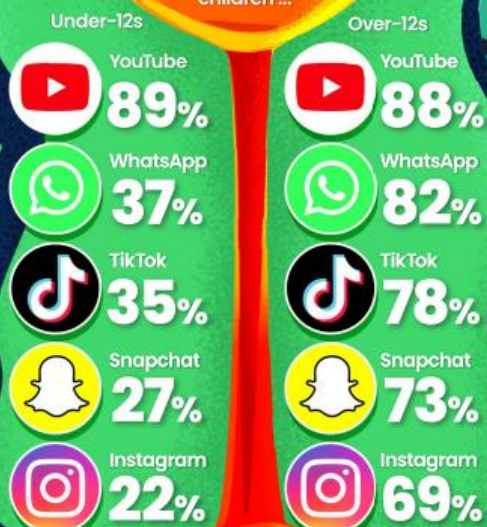
SCREEN TIME

Forest School- please return all reply slips before the half term break so that your child can attend in Summer 2.



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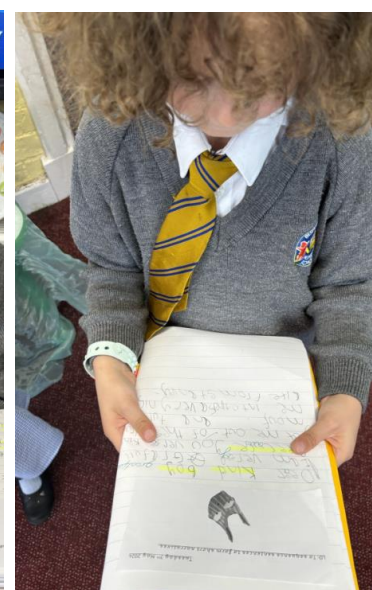
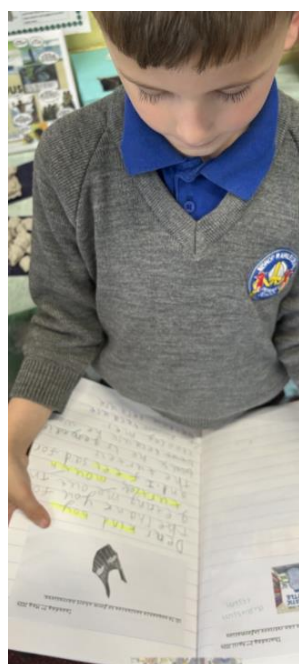
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Orange Class:

Furthermore, last week was Mental Health Awareness Week. The children concentrated on their physical wellbeing, participating in Jump Start Johnny and Just Dance.



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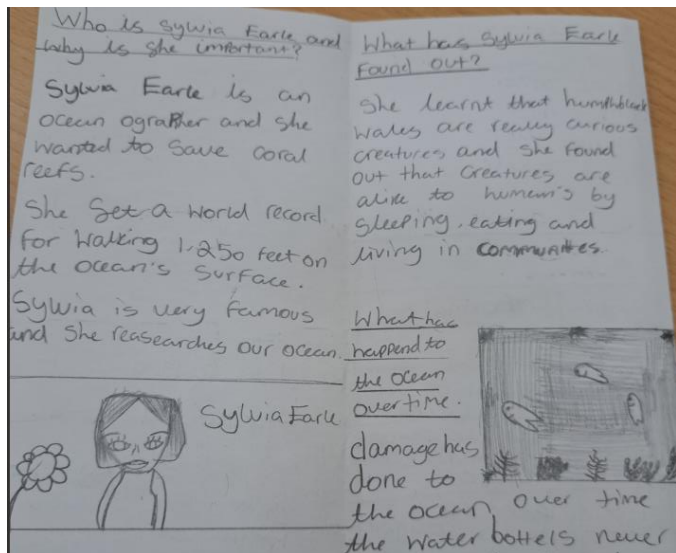
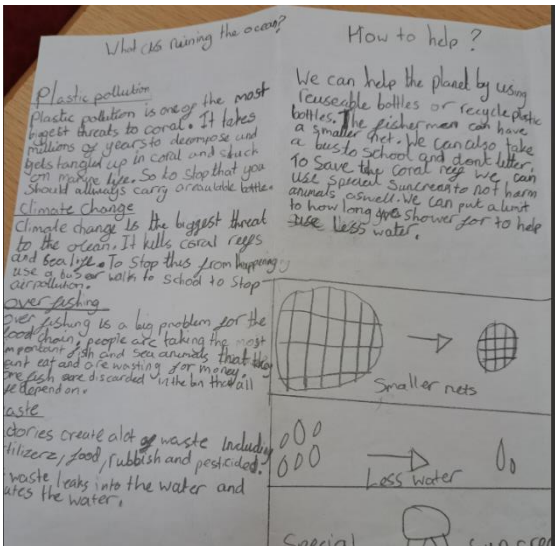
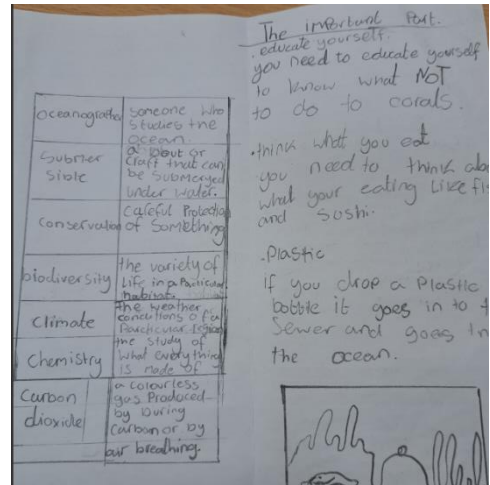
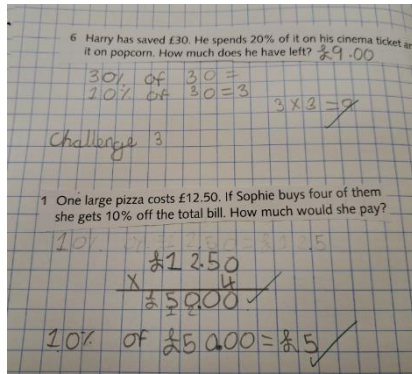
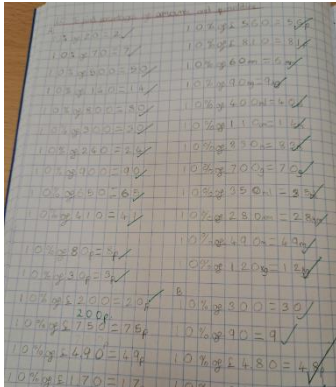




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Indigo Class

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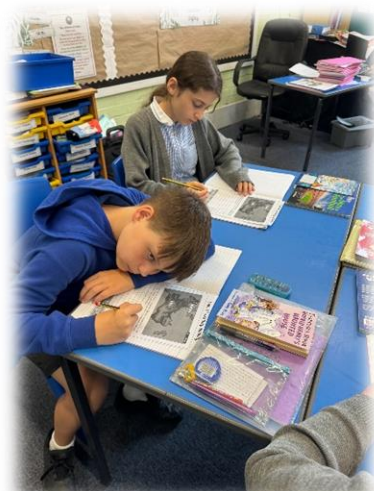
Violet Class
