We have also been learning about the meaning of remembrance, considering the sacrifices made for what we have today.



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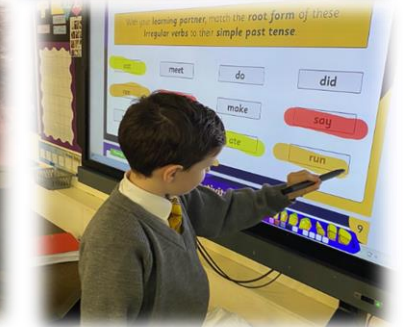


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Yellow Class

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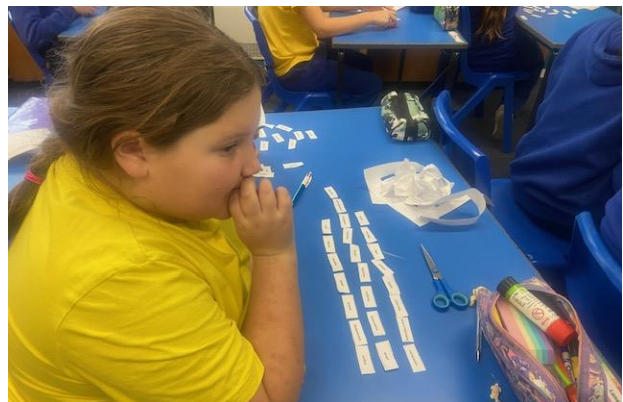


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Violet Class
